Dear Friends,

April has been an interesting month dealing with necessary changes due to the pandemic. We have suffered a great loss by having to suspend our volunteer enrichment program, and we are anxious to restore it as soon as it is safe to do so. On the positive side, we have seen an increase in adoptions, so our residents are finding excellent forever homes!

The loneliness and isolation caused by 'Stay at Home' orders have resulted in a trend of increased adoptions and fosters throughout the US. Several shelters are low or completely out of adoptable pets. Now is a wonderful time to acclimate a new family member to a household when you are home all day. Many rescues, though, are concerned about what will happen when people return to work in coming months.

The adoption process at Hallie Hill is designed to have adopters be thoughtful about the decision to bring a new pet home. It is, after all, going to be a family member that will hopefully bring years of love, joy, and companionship. We often get inquiries asking, "how much?" for the dog or cat. We have many people wanting to stop by and adopt an animal that same day. This is where our adoption coordinator, Caroline Ruiz, must educate the potential adopter about our process.

Our adoption procedure starts with an online application that is short and simple. It asks some basic questions to give us an idea what the household is like and to help us decide what animal might be a good fit for the family. It also asks for the name and number of the applicant's veterinarian so Caroline can call and get a reference. We want to be sure that the adopter has provided well for past and current pets and is keeping them up to date on vaccinations and heart worm and flea prevention. Caroline then reaches out to the applicants to ask follow-up questions to determine which animals they are most interested in meeting. She then schedules an appointment for a 'meet and greet'.

Approved adopters visit the Sanctuary and spend time with the animals they are considering. If there is another dog already in the home, they bring it to the sanctuary as well to make introductions. This appointment allows us to answer questions about the animals and counsel the adopters about what challenges and joys may accompany the pet if it is chosen for adoption. In some cases, Caroline will send follow up information to provide help in specific instances such as how to introduce a cat to a dog, or how to work with a fearful dog.

After the pet is adopted, Caroline periodically reaches out to the adopter for updates. If there is a concern, we try to make suggestions or provide resources that can help. We love to see and hear how the adoptees are adjusting to their new life in their fur-ever home!

There is nothing more satisfying and heartwarming for us than to have the opportunity to complete a family by introducing them to a pet that they can love and that will love them unconditionally, right back!







Jazz-up your best friend's walks

Change Speed

Say your dog's name for attention before walking double your usual pace or walking at half speed.



Sit & Observe

Find a quiet bench and allow your dog to look around. Everytime he spots something unfamiliar, give him a treat. This helps to provide positive associations



Ten 'Straight Sits'

A 'Straight Sit' is your dog sitting by your side, with 'his nose pointing in the same direction as your toes'. Achieve ten per walk.



Play 'Red Light, Green Light'

This can teach a dog to walk nicely. When the lead goes tight RED LIGHT STOP When the lead is stack, **GREEN LIGHT GO** and keep walking



Let your Dog Decide

Give your dog a choice. Apply common sense and caution but allow your dog to dictate the route of your pavement walk.



Ten 'About-Turns'

An 'About-Turm' is you and your dog turning and walking back in the same direction you just walked. Say your dog's name,



turn away from your dog and guide him. Achieve ten per walk.

'Search-Back'

Drop something like a glove or keys. Carry on walking a few steps. Stop and send your dog back to find it with the word 'Find' and a straight arm You can begin by dropping a treat.



Play 'Wassis?' Help to train focus away

from unwanted things. Ramdomly hold a treat and drop down. Drop the treat and excitedly point and say



"Wassis?". Allow your dog to locate and eat it.

Change Sides!

If you are used to walking your dog only on one side (the left, for example). Have a go at swapping sides and walking on the right. You may need some treats to help train this



Eye contact starts the Walking

This encourages a 'check-in' Occasionally stop and wait. The second your dog looks up at you, say 'good' and continue on. This can take a white initually but gets quicker.

10 Best Game Apps for Cats

Cats have already taken over our hearts. But what if they take over our smartphones and tablets, too? We came up with 10 fun ideas on how to entertain your fluffy friends (and yourself as well!) using some games for cats on your gadgets.

Playing with cats has plenty of benefits for your pet's physical and mental health. First of all, it helps reduce their anxiety, especially when you're away for hours during the day. Also, cat games engage their natural curiosity and playful instinct. And don't forget to reward your cat for winning!

Tablets are better than phones for playing with cats. With the larger screen, your cat will be more engaged and responsive. It will be easier for the pet to move the paws across the device and catch mouse, fish, bug or dot. Be patient! It's okay if your cat is not engaged with the game app right away. You should try again later. Don't forget to show your pet how to play the game. She might engage with it as soon as get an idea of the game

1. Friskies Cat Fishing 2 — Free for iOS or Android

A classic fish app for cats. Challenge your pet to catch fish as many times as it can! This game has three levels with one, two and three fish at a time.

2. Friskies JitterBug — Free for iOS or Android

In case your cat got tired of fish, here come bugs! The idea is the same as in Cat Fishing 2. All your pet needs to do is to catch bugs during five 15-second rounds. You can share the score on your Facebook and compete with other cat owners!



3. Pet Cube App — Free for iOS or Android

The Petcube app lets you play with your cat while you're not there using the Petcube Play 2 pet camera with a built-in laser toy. The laser will move around the room while you're dragging your finger across the smartphone screen from anywhere you are. You can see how your pet is trying to catch the dot from your phone as well! If you don't have a Petcube camera, you still can use the app to play with other pets! Just search for the public and shared cameras in your feed.

4. Paint For Cats — \$1.99 For iOS

Who knows, maybe your cat is the future Pollock? Find out about your pet's hidden talent using the Paint For Cats app on your iPad! Choose one of ten color palettes and the masterpiece will be created while your cat is chasing the digital mouse. When it's done, you can email the painting to your friends (or Louvre) and share it on your Facebook page.



5. Cat Alone - Cat Toy — \$0.99 for iOS or Android

A beautifully designed cat app for your smartphone or tablet. There are 6 options to play around with — laser pointer, ladybug, finger, fly, butterfly, and cockroach. Each of them is accompanied by a typical sound.

6. Pocket Pond 2 — Free for iOS or Android

This is not just another fish app for cats. First of all, it's insanely realistic and beautiful! Thousands of different exotic kinds of koi are swimming across your tablet or phone like in a real pond. With Pocket Pond 2 you can raise, breed, sell fish and decorate your own pond. And your cat will definitely be excited to play with it, too!

7. Cat Toys I: Games for Cats — \$0.99 for iOS or Android

This cat app will definitely catch your cat's attention with 6 fun games: Ladybug Smasher, Laser Pointer, Fly Smasher, Butterfly Smasher, Chase the Mouse, and CatFishing.

8. Cat Playground — \$1.99 for Android

Train your cat to catch a mouse, a fish or a laser pointer. The more it catches, the more points it earns.



9. Mouse — Free for Android

Your kitty will have some fun catching a mouse that runs across your tablet or smartphone screen and eats cheese. An easy and funny cat game app!



10. Cat Clicker Training — Free for iOS

A perfect app for clicker training cats for your iPhone or iPad! When your pet touches the paw on the screen, your device produces the click sound. You can choose between different colors of paws and background.


