How to Tell Cats You Love Them



Cats and humans don't always speak the same language. Luckily, there are easy ways to let your kitty know you adore him/her. We've compiled some here to help you bridge the communication gap between you and your feline friend.

<u>Slow Eye Blink at Her</u>

Cats slow eye blink at each other and at their humans when they're feeling relaxed and loving. You can slow eye blink back at your cat, too, and she'll understand the feline gesture as love.

<u>Use Interactive Toys to Play with Her</u>

Cats are predators, but they often don't get to use those instincts as much as they need to when they're house cats. You can allow your cat the outlet of chasing prey by providing interactive toys for her. Spend at least 10 minutes a day playing with your cat using a wand toy. Predator-prey play helps keeps cats mentally and physically healthy.

Give Her Comfortable Beds and Plenty of Them

Cats love to sleep and providing great quality, cozy beds is a great way to show yours you love her. Many cats like to be up high, so consider a tall cat tree with a roomy bed on top. That way, your cat can get above her territory and survey it. She'll know you love her when you provide her with this amenity.

Provide Great Cat Scratching Posts

Cats need to scratch to stay emotionally and physically healthy. But they don't like to scratch just anything. Sisal fabric is a great cat scratching substrate, and when it's wrapped around a tall, sturdy post, it's cat scratching heaven.

<u>Give Her a Hiding Spot</u>

Cats like to hide, watching things from the safety of an enclosed space. Give your cat cardboard boxes and cat caves to show her that you understand and love her.

<u>Snuggle Her</u>

Not all cats like to cuddle, but those that do will be over the moon when you make time for snuggling daily. Get yourself a lap blanket so your cat's happy muffin-making claws don't poke your legs, and get to showing your cat you love her with some quality cozy time.

Give Her Whiskers a Break

Did you know that cats can get whisker fatigue? If you're using water and food bowls that push back on her whiskers when she eats and drinks, you may be unwittingly causing your cat pain.

Get a cat fountain and an anti-whisker fatigue bowl and place them on opposite sides of the room. Cats don't like to eat and drink close to each other, so giving her whiskers a break and separating her food and water sources will let her know that

5 Ways to Tell Your Dog You Love Him

To say that I love my dog would be an understatement. I adore him. He is one of the best things in my life, and there's nothing I wouldn't do to keep him healthy and happy. Showing him how much he means to me can be a little tricky though.

Even though I know that most dogs aren't the biggest fans of big hugs, I sometimes have to fight the urge to give Chilly a loving squeeze. After all, hugging is one of the most natural ways for humans to show affection. However, for many of our canine companions, a hug is unwelcome or even threatening, especially if they feel trapped.

Some dog parents make the mistake of thinking that the best way to their dog's heart is through his stomach. Don't get me wrong — treats and goodies do have their place (especially as rewards when training), but too many of them can easily lead to weight gain and all of the health issues that come with it.

While treats should be limited and hugs should usually be avoided, there are still lots of ways that you can shower your dog with endless love in language he's sure to understand!

<u>1. Gaze Into His Eyes</u>

One way to show your pup you love him is through eye contact. Take a quiet moment, speak softly to him and pet him gently, and just stare into his eyes. Try raising your eyebrows (especially the left one). Your dog will view this as a display of affection.

A word of caution: you should only maintain direct eye contact with a dog who knows and trusts you. A dog who is not familiar with you is more likely to interpret this gesture as a threat or a challenge.

<u>2. Rub His Ears</u>

Instead of patting your pup on the top of the head, try giving him a gentle rub behind the ears. Watch his reaction — he will most likely melt into a ball of doggy happiness. This is because rubbing a dog's ears actually stimulates the release of endorphins – hormones that relieve pain and bring on feelings of pleasure.



<u>3. Lean on Him</u>

Has your dog ever pressed up against your legs or leaned into you while you were sitting together? This is one way that dogs seek affection – kind of like a doggie hug. You can "hug" him back by doing the same thing.

<u>4. Have Fun Together</u>

Spend some time every day doing something that your dog enjoys. Try teaching him a new trick or practicing ones he already knows. Take him out in the back yard or down to the dog park for a game of frisbee or fetch with his favorite toy. Not only will your dog feel loved, but the exercise will help to keep him (and you) healthy.

<u>5. Snuggle</u>

Dogs may not enjoy being hugged, but they love cuddling. Dogs are pack animals, and close contact makes them feel safe and secure. Allowing your pooch to sleep with you is the ultimate display of trust and affection since this is when you are the most vulnerable. However, even if you'd prefer to keep your bed dog-free, you can still create opportunities every day to tell your dog you love him by snuggling up on the couch or in a cozy corner with him on the floor. He'll be sure to get your message.







How to Find a Responsible Dog Breeder!

Think this is a funny message in a Sanctuary Newsletter? We at Hallie Hill, and at the Humane Society of the United States, strongly encourage you to consider adoption from a shelter or rescue, but we know that there are people out there who prefer a 'purebred' dog or cat! If that's what you choose to do, it's ok, but PLEASE be responsible! There are MANY breed-specific rescues out there (see next page), and we would hope that you would look there first to adopt the breed of your choice! If that isn't an option for you, please review the following responsible breeder checklist so you can choose a breeder who has the animals' best interest at heart!

RESPONIBLE BREEDER CHECKLIST

- \Rightarrow Responsible breeders only sell puppies to people they have met in person never through pet stores or online to people they haven't met.
- \Rightarrow Responsible breeders encourage you to visit and see where the puppy was born and raised.
- \Rightarrow Responsible breeders will not keep dogs in crowded spaces or cages. Their dogs will be in clean, roomy, comfortable areas.
- \Rightarrow Responsible breeders breed very sparingly. They specialize in only one or a few breeds and don't always have puppies available.
- \Rightarrow Responsible Breeders will show you individual records of veterinary visits for you puppy and the parents.
- \Rightarrow Responsible breeders will want you to sign a contract and will ask you to return the puppy to them if you are ever unable to keep the dog.
