Dear Friends,

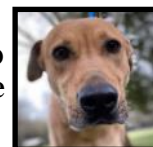
Spring is upon us and this new season brings us more animals needing either a temporary or long term safe-haven. Many of our residents come to us because their owner has passed away or can no longer afford their care. Anyone with a pet knows how expensive medical care can become when a pet is older or becomes ill! I want to introduce you to 3 very special dogs, and 1 cat, that will need your help to cover medical expenses in the upcoming months.

Molly Mae is a 7 year old Portuguese Water Dog whose owner passed away unexpectedly. When we noticed her limping, the veterinarian confirmed our fear that she has a partially torn cruciate ligament in need of repair. Without this surgery, it will be too painful for Molly to run and play.



Doris is a sweet bloodhound mix who came to us from Berkeley Animal Care. She had a hernia, which we already had repaired, but sadly she also needs surgery to correct her two subluxated patellas (displaced kneecaps).

Most recently, we accepted a younger fella named Rafiki, who also has a torn cruciate which is very painful to him. Surgery will be needed to make him pain free, functional and well again.



Dell, the cat, is a medium sized female who has never been chosen by an adopter. She has been diagnosed with feline stomatitis, a painful chronic oral disease. She is going to require dental surgery to remove several teeth.

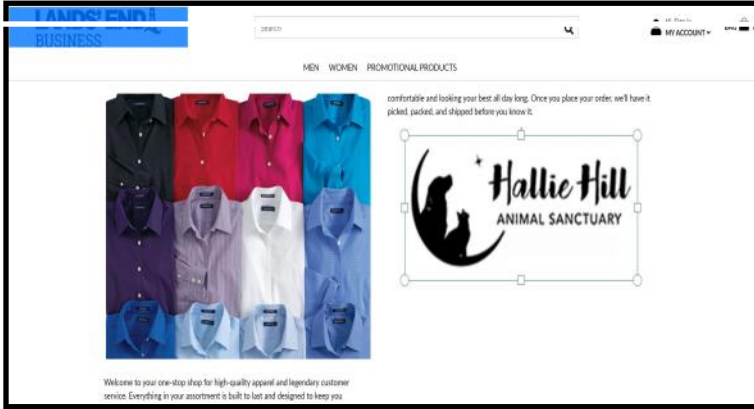

Signs Your Kitty Would Love A Second Cat

For most cat owners, we are the proud owners of multiple cats. And if you're not and you've considered it, how do you know if your cat would enjoy having a second cat in your home? Of course, change is not always a good thing when it comes to your cat's delicate mindset. But a slow introduction to second cat in your home can go well when done the right way. Wondering if your kitty would love having a cat friend in the home to become best fur friends forever? Here are some key signs that your cat would enjoy another cat in the home.



Kitty Likes To Play

Is your cat playful and seems to have endless energy? Well, having adding another cat to your family can help them to expend it in the purrfect way! This can be especially purrfect if you have a job that keeps you away from the home for extended hours each day. *After all, if you don't work hard you can't give your cat the nice life he deserves.* By adding another cat in with your family, this could help your active kitty to have someone to keep them company in your absence.

Myth Busted:

Despite what some people (probably silly dog people!) may say, cats are not solitary animals. Sure, your cat is more independent and may not greet you each day when you return home, but cats can become depressed or anxious when left alone for too long on a routine basis. Cats are very tuned into their environment because they're hardwired as predators. Their keen senses are on high alert for the sight, sound or smell of potential prey. So you may interpret as a cat being aloof. But it's actually your exquisitely designed companion being ready for anything. Just because your cat may not jump to immediate attention when you call her name, doesn't mean she's aloof – she's focused.

Affectionate Kitty Cat

Is your cat loving and sweet with you? Well, purrhaps they could dole out that love to another cat in the home as well! Cats that are gentle and loving are generally more accepting of other cats and do not seem them as a threat (*or at least we think they don't, for the most part!*). Spread the love and add another cat so they can give their love to their new feline friend as well. Many shelter cats will have detailed descriptions telling about them, and if you find one that does well with other cats, this could be a purrfect match.

Kitty Misses Their Old Friend

Cats will grieve after the loss of a loved one, whether it's a human or another cat. Sure, they aren't going to tell you about it, but trust us, it does happen. If your cat once had another cat in the home that they got along with, chances are that they could be open to the idea of having a cat friend in their home once again. You will definitely need to go slow with the introduction and practice patience. Sometimes breakups, divorces, or people moving out of the home means that cats who were once bonded will be separated. While no cat can replace what they've lost in the absence of their best fur friend, it can help to mend a broken heart once some time passes and adding a new cat feels right for your family.

Clinger Cat



We love it when our cats grant us with their affection, but when it borderlines neurotic or obsessive behavior, this could be a sign that your cat would enjoy another cat in the home. Your cat doesn't have the ability to tell you that they're bored/restless/feeling insecure. Adding a second cat to your home could help to ease their uneasiness by relieving some of their anxiety. Now, at first it might not seem that way, but with time they could establish a lifelong bond that will bring them the companionship they crave.

Your Cat Suddenly Eats Much More Than Usual

While a medical issue can be signaled by changes to your cat's eating behavior, boredom can lead to overeating for your cat. Lack of stimulation, both mental and/or physical, can have your cat eating more than they should out of boredom. *"Just like with people, the cat may turn to food because there's nothing else to do," says Pam Johnson-Bennett, a certified cat behavior consultant and owner of Cat Behavior Associates in Nashville.*

Naughty Kitty

Your cat may have lots of energy that has them getting into trouble when their playful nature turns destructive. By adding another cat to your home, it might help them to redirect their energy in a more positive way. *"If there's nothing to do and no one to play with, the cat will find something," Johnson-Bennett says. "Because they're predators, they are born to move and discover."*

5 REASONS TO ADOPT TWO KITTENS INSTEAD OF JUST ONE

1. One kitten can become lonely and bored.
2. Two kittens will help keep each other busy instead of bugging you.
3. Having two kittens is very entertaining!
4. You'll have fewer behavioral issues with two kittens.
5. You'll save TWO lives instead of one!

Adding a second cat into your life is a serious decision for both you and your existing cat in your home. Do your homework and try finding the most suitable companion for them. This way the transition and pairing will work best for all parties involved. And when you see your cats bonding for the first time, we guarantee your heart will skip a beat!

PET POISON PREVENTION WEEK MARCH 15TH THROUGH THE 31ST!

Here are the top 10 most common toxins that Pet Poison Helpline gets called about. Now keep in mind that some of these listed are very toxic, while some are minimally toxic (like ant baits and silica packs). When in doubt, call your vet or Pet Poison Helpline to make sure there won't be a problem. Take special care to keep these toxins out of your pet's reach and pet-proof your house!

Dog Poisons

1. Chocolate
2. Mouse and Rat Poisons (rodenticides)
3. Anti-inflammatory medications
4. Xylitol (sugar-free gum & more)
5. Grapes & Raisins
6. Antidepressant Medications
7. Acetaminophen (e.g., Tylenol)
8. Vitamin D Overdose
9. Stimulant Medications (e.g., for ADD/ADHD)
10. Fertilizers



Cat Poisons

1. Lilies (*Lilium* species)
2. Spot-on flea/tick medication for dogs
3. Household Cleaners
4. Antidepressant Medications
5. Essential Oils
6. Anti-inflammatory Medications
7. Mouse & Rat Poisons (rodenticides)
8. Stimulant Medications (e.g., for ADD/ADHD)
9. Onions & Garlic
10. Vitamin D Overdose



If you suspect your pet has ingested any of these items or any other questionable substance, call Pet Poison Helpline or your veterinarian for assistance. Accurate and timely identification of the suspected substance is very important. Having the container, package, or label in hand will save valuable time and may save the life of your pet.

EMERGENCY INSTRUCTIONS FOR POISONING

Did your dog or cat just eat something poisonous? Call your veterinarian or Pet Poison Helpline at 855-764-7661 for help immediately! The sooner a dog poisoning or cat poisoning is diagnosed, the easier, less expensive, and safer it is for your pet to get treated!

What to do if your dog or cat is poisoned:

- **Remove your pet from the area.**
- **Check to make sure your pet is safe: breathing and acting normally.**
- **Do NOT give any home antidotes.**
- **Do NOT induce vomiting without consulting a vet or Pet Poison Helpline.**
- **Call Pet Poison Helpline at 855-764-7661.**

If veterinary attention is necessary, contact your veterinarian or emergency veterinary clinic immediately.

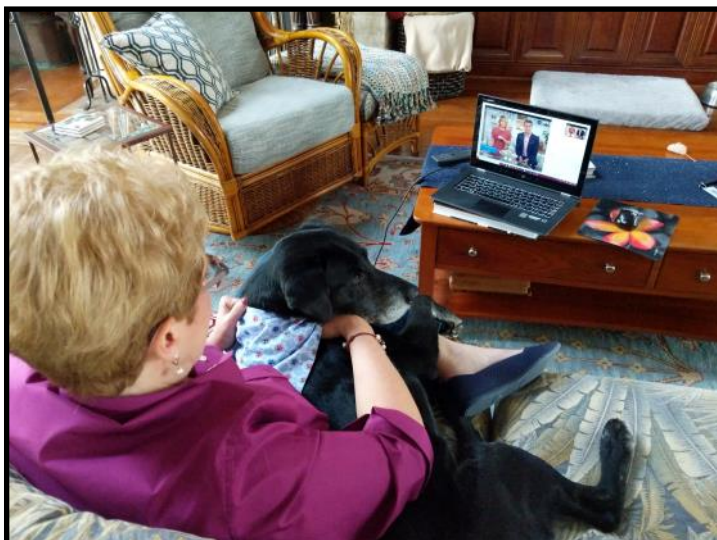
Detailed Instructions:

1. Immediately remove your pet from the area, and make sure no other pets (or kids!) are exposed to this area. Safely remove any remaining poisonous material from their reach.
2. Check to make sure your pet is breathing normally and acting fine otherwise.
3. Collect a sample of the material, along with the packaging, vial, or container, and save it – you will need all that information when you talk to your veterinarian or to a Pet Poison Helpline expert.
4. Do NOT give your dog any milk, food, salt, oil, or any other home remedies! Also, never inducing vomiting without talking to your veterinarian or Pet Poison Helpline – it may actually be detrimental or contraindicated to induce vomiting!
5. Don't give hydrogen peroxide to your pet without checking with a vet or with Pet Poison Helpline first. For you cat lovers, hydrogen peroxide doesn't work well to induce vomiting (it just causes massive foaming and salivating instead!), and stronger veterinary prescription medications are necessary to get your cat to vomit up the poison Kitty ingested!
6. Get help. Program your veterinarian phone number, along with an ER vet and Pet Poison Helpline's phone number (855-764-7661) in your cell phone so you will always have immediate access to help.

Keep in mind that the prognosis is always better when a toxicity is reported immediately, so don't wait to see if your pet becomes symptomatic before calling for help. It's always less expensive, and safer for your pet for you to call immediately. Remember that there's a narrow window of time when we can decontaminate (induce vomiting or pump the stomach) in the case of a poisoning!

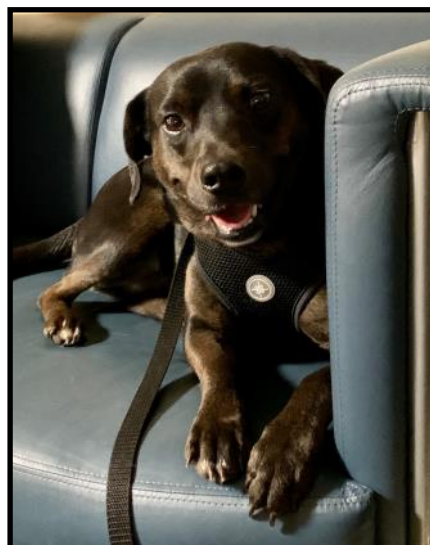

March's Adorable Adoptables!



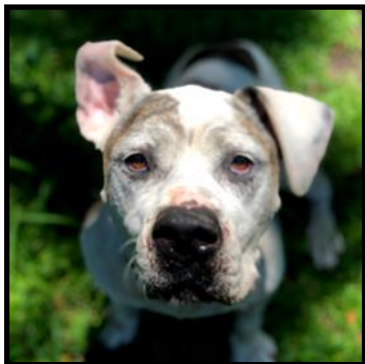
Jack

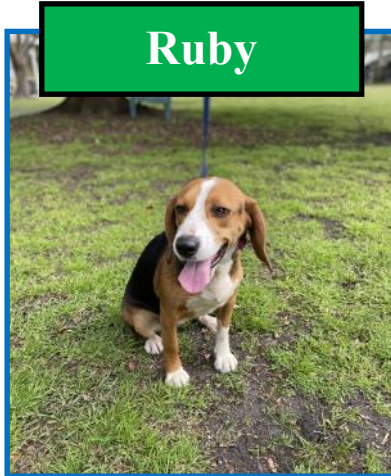

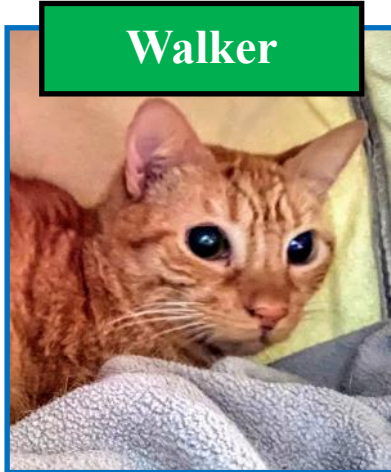

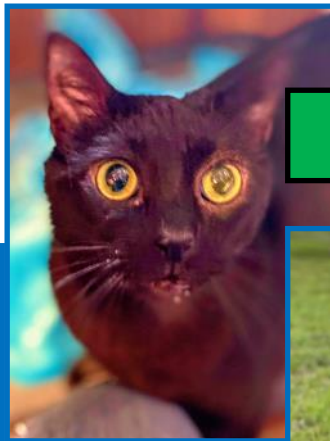
