Cooper is so loving toward his adoptive mom that her husband claimed "If he was a man, I'd have to shoot him".

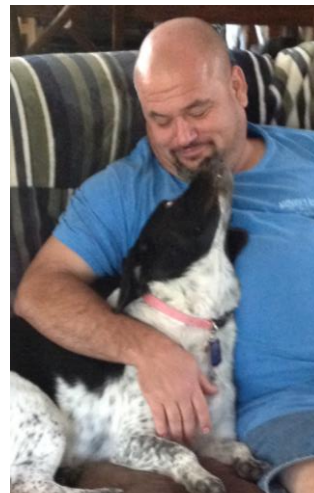
Grady enjoys cereal each morning with his mom, daily rides in the golf cart, a fan on the porch if he is outside, and regularly makes himself comfy on the couch.

Walter stayed at the vet clinic for 11 days receiving treatment and TLC for the wounds. Six months later he required additional surgery on his hip.
