Guess what you've made possible through your generous support of Hallie Hill? Lifesaving care and treatment for our animals in need! Here are just a few examples:



*Mika* came from a local overcrowded shelter and had a slight cough on intake. Radiographs of her chest showed poor Mika had a diaphragmatic hernia allowing organs that should have been in her abdomen to migrate up into her chest cavity. This serious condition required an immediate surgical repair by a specialist. Mika's surgery was a success, and she is currently recovering at the sanctuary.

This little calico named *Chloe* was surrendered by her owner who told us she was 'lost outside for seven weeks.' This sweet girl was severely emaciated and unwilling to eat upon arrival to the sanctuary. Her skin, gums, even the whites of her eyes started to turn yellow with jaundice. One of our veterinarian's initiated a treatment plan that has Chloe well on the road to recovery.





Amelia came to the sanctuary very thin with a heavy burden of intestinal parasites. When she did not start to gain weight after treatment for the parasites, a return veterinary visit uncovered a mass in her abdomen which could not be identified. Exploratory surgery revealed a grossly enlarged and diseased kidney. The kidney was successfully removed and now Amelia has a chance at a happy life!





If you share your life with a feline family member, you probably already know from experience what scientific research has now proven: like dogs and children, cats also form secure (and insecure) bonds with their humans

Researchers have also concluded that like dogs, most cats are securely attached to their humans, which means that they, too, can develop feline separation anxiety under certain circumstances

Risk factors for separation anxiety in cats include being orphaned or weaned too early, and living in environments that aren't beneficial to confidence-building

Signs of feline separation anxiety include crying or meowing excessively when favorite humans are away, refusing to eat, eliminating outside the litterbox, or grooming excessively

There are many ways to relieve your kitty's separation anxiety, starting with environmental enrichment and lifestyle optimization

Zits—they're the worst! Cats are just as prone to acne as humans, and their blocked pores appear as blackheads underneath their chins. Feline acne can have a number of catalysts, including stress. Some cats are also genetically predisposed to it or may have an adverse reaction to a plastic food bowl or another household allergen. If left untreated, these blocked pores can become infected, scab over, and even create bald patches on your cat's fur. If your cat has acne, consult your veterinarian for a

treatment that may include prescription ointments, medicated pads or even oral antibiotics.







# **Deaf Dogs: Living** with Hearing Loss

While most dogs experience some degree of hearing loss during their lifetime, deafness does not have to mean a decreased quality of life—for you or your dog! Learn the signs of hearing loss in dogs and how to manage deafness at home here.

#### What is deafness?

Deafness refers to a complete or partial loss of hearing. This loss can be temporary or permanent and it may affect one or both ears. Temporary or transient deafness is most often due to buildup of wax or debris in the ear canals, while permanent deafness can have a number of causes, including untreated ear infections, injury, drug toxicity, tumors, congenital (birth) defects and old age.

### What are the symptoms of deafness in dogs?

A dog with significant hearing loss may:

- Show a change in obedience or attentiveness
- Appear unresponsive to everyday sounds, such as the doorbell or vacuum
- Appear unresponsive to his/her name
- Fail to respond to familiar verbal commands
- Be difficult to rouse from sleep
- Be less active
- Bark excessively
- Shake or tilt his/her head

# **How to Train a Deaf Dog**

You might think a deaf dog is extra challenging to train and own. Although they require a shift in technique, they aren't much more of a commitment than any other dog. You need to teach them basic obedience, just as you would with a dog who can hear, and with a few other lessons like focus and startle resistance, your deaf dog can understand and obey you with ease. Whether your dog was born deaf or lost hearing with age or an ailment, read on to learn how to train a deaf dog.

#### Teach Focus

Because your deaf dog can't hear your voice, you must rely on visual cues like hand signals or other body language to communicate. But your dog can't see your signals if they aren't looking at you. So, the first step in training a deaf dog is teaching them to focus on you. Start by rewarding your dog with a treat or game anytime they voluntarily look at you. This will reinforce the behavior and your dog will learn that paying attention to you is worth their while. In addition, games like hide-and -seek encourage your dog to check in with you.

It's also valuable to teach your dog a signal that means look at me. You can't speak their name or use a verbal cue like "Watch Me," but you can use anything your dog can sense like a gentle touch or a flash of light. Simply pair the signal with a reward. When your dog is looking at you, give the signal then feed a treat. Next wait until your dog is looking away before you give the signal and offer the treat. In time, your dog will turn to you as soon as they experience the signal. Now you have a way of asking for attention when your dog is preoccupied.


