5 Reasons Why Dog Dental Care Is Important

How would you feel if you never brushed your teeth? Constantly having lots of plaque and an unpleasant taste in your mouth would probably be more than you could tolerate. Your wallet probably wouldn't feel so good either after having to pay a hefty dentist bill to get your oral health back in good shape. Now imagine what could happen to your dog's mouth without proper **dog dental care**. The simple answer is: dog dental disease.

Dental diseases in dogs are quite common. By age 3, over 80 percent of dogs have some form of dental disease, also known as **periodontal disease**. Dog dental disease has serious consequences, so maintaining good dog dental care is very important. What Is Dental Disease?

Dental disease affects the teeth, gums and structures that support and surround a dog's teeth. It begins with plaque buildup on the teeth. This plaque contains bacteria and food particles. Plaque that stays on the teeth hardens into tartar. When tartar is above the gumline, it's easily visible, and your veterinarian can remove it relatively easily during a professional dental cleaning. However, looks can be deceiving. A set of pearly whites doesn't necessarily mean that your dog's mouth is healthy. Tartar that makes its way below the gumline is the real problem.

Dos & Don'ts

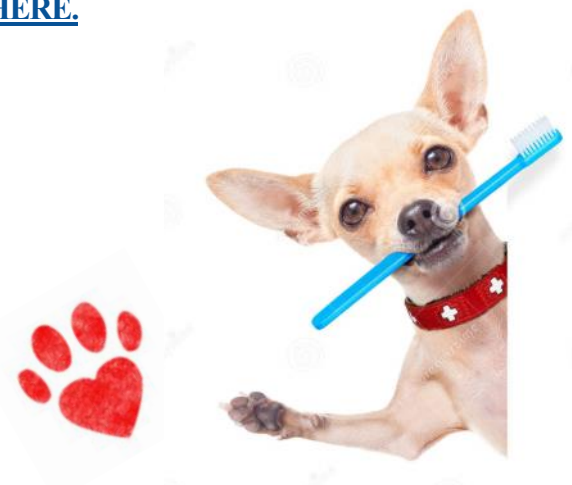
DO's

- Brush your dog's teeth at least once a week.
- Check your pet's mouth and gums for abnormalities once a month. Look for swollen gums, brownish tartar on teeth, worse than usual bad breath, excessive drooling, and any loose teeth.
- Invest in chew toys which help remove tartar from their teeth.
- Look for food and treats formulated for dental care and approved by the Veterinary Oral Health Council (VOHC)

DON'Ts

- Use human toothpaste. Flouride is very dangerous for pets and there may be other harmful ingredients not meant for our furry friends.
- Ignore the signs of gum disease. Make a trip to a Veterinary Dental Care Professional at least once a year.
- Give up - ease your dog slowly into teeth brushing. He or she may not be used to this new ritual, but with patience, time and treats they will get there!

Your Cat's Adorable Belly Flap Explained

If your cat is at a healthy weight but has what looks like a saggy belly, that's their **primordial pouch**. This protective layer comprised of fat, skin, and fur **protects your cat's internal organs, helps them move faster and acts as extra food storage.**

If your cat is a healthy weight but has what looks like a saggy belly, rest assured all is well.

Sagging bellies on cats aren't bellies at all, but primordial pouches designed by nature.

This pouch, comprised of fat, skin, and fur, sits below the internal organs and is likely there for protection of those organs during fights; to help cats move faster with greater flexibility; and to store the "leftovers" of a big meal for future fueling.

Both domestic and wild cats have primordial pouches; domestic cats begin to develop theirs at around 6 months of age.

It's important to recognize the difference between a primordial pouch and an overfed tummy on cats.

1. You have more than one cat.
2. Your cat eats better than you.
3. Your cat's comfort comes first.
4. You talk to your cat like a human.
5. Your cat is the boss of the house.

Cat Introductions

#1 - Safe Room
Create a private space for your new cat. It should be in a room you frequent, with all necessary resources for your cat, and no access (even visual) to the rest of the house.

#2 - Swap Scents
Swap cat beds between the two cats' territories, so that each cat can get used to the other cat's smell.

#3 - Swap Sites
Move the new cat into a bathroom. Move the resident cat to the new cat's safe room, then let the new cat out of the bathroom to explore the rest of the house.

#4 - Closed Door Feedings
Feed the cats on opposite sides of a closed door. Start at a comfortable distance from the door, and move the bowls closer with each feeding.

#5 - Gate Feedings
Slowly allow the cats to see each other during their meals. Use a covered baby gate with a towel over it, for example.

#6 - Playtime
Begin playing with the resident cat. Bring in the new cat and immediately begin playing with it. Keep sessions short at first, and end the sessions on a positive note.

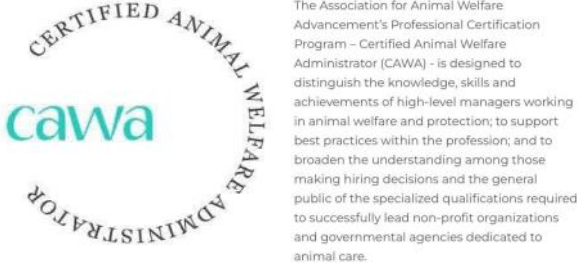
