THE CAT CORNER

Behaviour Modification for

Fearful Cats

Step 1: Meeting Minimum Welfare Criteria

Before beginning a behaviour modification plan, make sure the cat it is eating, drinking,

and using the litter box, at least when people are not around. This is to ensure we do not inappropriately add stress to the cat. Once the cat is meeting these criteria, begin behaviour modification using the following steps.



First, offer the cat food using an extension of a hand such as a long spoon or touch stick. As the cat becomes comfortable eating from the hand extender, gradually move the hand up the handle toward the cat, until they are eating from the person's hand.

Step 5: Increasing Petting and Scratching

Increase both the duration and intensity of petting if the cat shows signs of tolerating this well.

Continue petting for short periods after treats are finished to test if the cat has learned to enjoy petting.

Step 2: Eating with Person in Room

Offer the cat high-value food in a bowl while a person sits quietly in the same room approximately 3 feet away.

Step 4: Allowing Light Touch


Slowly and gently reach an empty hand toward the cat followed by offering food from the other hand. If using the hand feels unsafe, switch to a touch stick.

Retract food hand and petting hand at the same time so the cat does not get treats while the hand is removed. As the cat becomes more comfortable, incorporate gentle movements of the first hand or touch stick, then start incorporating light touch (barely grazing the top of the fur) behind the ears or on the back of the neck.



Behaviour Modification Tips and Tricks

- Go slow and steady patience is key!
- Use a quiet voice, slow movements, and avoid looking a fearful cat directly in the eyes.
- To begin, keep each session brief (approximately 2-3 minutes).
- Try a wide variety of high-value treats to determine a cat's preference (e.g. wet food or treats, canned fish, squeeze-up treats, dry or moist food or treats)
- Watch body language carefully to ensure the cat is comfortable. **Do not force interaction**. If the cat is highly fearful or showing aggression, go back to an earlier step without contact, or stop the session.
- Anxiety-reducing medication may be beneficial in a cat's behaviour modification program progression. Discuss options with your veterinarian.









Step 6: Seeking Attention Without Food

Observe if the cat will seek human attention without treats. When interacting, positive signs may include a cat leaning into pets, purring, and/or kneading with its feet. When petting stops, they may move toward the hand, lick or paw at the hands to solicit pets. When the cat is voluntarily approaching most people seeking physical contact, they are

OBSERVATIONS SHOW THAT MANY DOGS PREFER TO FORAGE, HUNT & SEEK OUT FOOD RATHER THAN HAVING IT FREELY AVAILABLE IN A BOWL

WHY WOULD DOGS PREFER TO PUT IN EFFORT WHEN FOOD IS FREELY AVAILABLE?

Foraging, hunting & seeking are natural / instinctive / rewarding behaviours

Dopamine levels in the brain increase when an opportunity to seek out food occurs but not when food is just presented

There is thrill / excitement / satisfaction & a sense of achievement in seeking out food rather than just having it in a bowl

Our modern living environment provides very little opportunity for dogs to engage in natural behaviours

Using food is a simple way to provide an outlet for a natural behaviour & create enrichment

Some ideas to try -

- · Snuffle mats · Scatter feeding
- · Food trails · Puzzle toys
- Food hidden in boxes / rolled up towel
- Hidden under containers / funnels
- · In empty toilet rolls stuffed with paper

We're still working on where she's supposed to be in the car. She likes to climb up into the front passenger seat when I step out and sometimes I'll even find her curled up on the driver seat!





8 Signs Your Dog May Be Too Cold

STORY AT-A-GLANCE

Whether or not it's too cold for your dog depends on a variety of factors, including coat thickness, age, health status, size, weight and coat color.

Other environmental factors should also be considered, such as wind chill, dampness, cloudiness and your dog's activity level.

If your dog is shivering, whining, holding up a paw or slowing down, it's a sign that he's too cold and needs to go indoors.

Some dogs enjoy wearing coats when outdoors on cold days; even with a coat, you shouldn't leave your dog unattended in cold weather and should monitor him closely for signs of discomfort.

If the temperatures are at or below 20°F, hypothermia and frostbite are a risk for all dogs.


How to Tell if Your Dog Is Cold

As a general guide, when temperatures dip below 45°F, dogs that don't love the cold start to feel uncomfortable. If it's below 32°F, small breeds, thin coated dogs, and old, young and sick dogs should be very carefully monitored for signs of discomfort.

The following signs signify that your dog is cold, and if you observe them it's not only time to head inside but also to consider outfitting your dog in a coat the next time you go outdoors, especially if it's for a longer period.

| Shivering | Holding up a paw |
|--------------|--------------------------|
| Anxiety | Searching for warmth |
| Whining | Weakness or limping |
| Slowing down | Lack of mental alertness |
