



I am always happy to explain to willing listeners as they tour the sanctuary how Hallie Hill is different from a 'shelter.' The main difference is that as a sanctuary, we can provide long term care if necessary. Most shelters have somewhat small enclosures for individual dogs, often housing them separately for safety. Dogs kept for extended periods of time

in a shelter setting often deteriorate behaviorally due to the stress of living in an unnatural environment. We are so fortunate at Hallie Hill to have the spacious enclosures for the dogs and cats, so they have the freedom to express normal behaviors such as digging, sniffing, exploring and more. But just like shelter workers, we also strive to provide different enrichment experiences to engage the animals' brains to maintain a positive emotional/mental state.



Thanks to our volunteers, we have great opportunities for dogs to walk around the sanctuary on 'Sniffaris' (much like a safari, but dogs are experiencing the world with their noses in the same way as we would with our binoculars.)



Food retrieval is a great enrichment technique. Dogs have Kongs or chewy treats, but the cats have these simple treat dispensers that make them work for a reward.



Thanks to amazing donors who provided CD players, more animals are appreciating music daily. We love the CD 'Through a Dogs Ear' (find it here).



We have a scent wagon with lavender, rosemary, mint, basil, catnip and more. The wagon is parked in a different location each day for animals to enjoy.





TRIBUTE

This year, students chose to work with a local charity that focuses on helping animals in need. The proceeds from the sale of Pass It On will be donated to Hallie Hill Animal Sanctuary located in Hollywood, SC. Hallie Hill's mission is to provide a compassionate haven with quality food and medical care for dogs and cats. Once they take in an animal, they promise it a home for the rest of their lives. While they know that they cannot change an animal's past, they can rewrite their future.

Hallie Hill cares for animals from across the Lowcountry, working with local shelters and veterinarians to provide necessary medical care. With 30 acres of land, Hallie Hill can shelter about 200 cats and dogs, fostering them in a safe and loving environment until they find a "forever home". Many of the animals they take in have suffered abuse, neglect, or abandonment. Hallie Hill works with the animals to prepare them for adoption by helping with rehabilitation and socialization. If an animal is unable to be adopted, Hallie Hill provides them with a loving home on their property.




