

WHY DOGS PULL ON LEASH

DOGS DON'T PULL BECAUSE THEY WANT TO BE THE PACK LEADER / TOP DOG / ALPHA / DOMINATE / ARE ON A MISSION FOR WORLD DOMINATION

DOGS PULL ON A LEASH BECAUSE

Held captive on leash is unnatural Dogs are meant to move around / explore an environment freely

Gets dogs to where they want to go faster Dogs naturally move much faster than us

IS IT FAIR / ETHICAL TO EXPECT -Dogs should never pull / always walk to heel / not explore / not stop & sniff

Use pain / discomfort - choke chains / prong collars / slip leads / yanking the leash to stop pulling

Walking close to us without pulling is not a natural behaviour It requires huge impulse control

Pulling makes the person move forward

Dogs are not meant to walk like robots stuck to our side

BE ETHICAL / BE FAIR .. Loose lead walking / long lines / decompression walks / sniff spots / reward for checking in Doys Disclosed

Stand side ways / squat or kneel down


Less threatening than face on / leaning over / towards a dog

Food & Water

- Two-week supply of food for each pet
- Portable food & water bowls
- Manual can opener (for canned food)
- Feeding instructions for each pet

Supplies

- Travel crate
- Harness & leash
- Collar with ID tags (if not microchipped or already wearing)
- Basic grooming supplies
- Favorite toys
- Pet first aid kit

Potty supplies: poop bags and/or absorbent potty pads

Vital Records

- Current photo of each pet
- Copies of medical records
- Copies of pet insurance
- Copies of registration information
- Your contact information and any behavioral notes

Medication

- Two-week supply of prescription medications
- One-month supply of flea, tick, and heartworm medications
- Instructions for giving medications

More Ways to Stay Prepared

- Microchip your pets to increase the likelihood they'll be returned
- Learn some basic pet first aid
- Store your kit in an accessible place and practice your evacuation plan

HOW HOT IS TOO HOT?!

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

- One common indication of sunstroke in dogs is excessive panting, which may be
- You might notice that your dog becomes restless, lethargic, drowsy or uncoordinated
 - Other symptoms can include drooling, vomiting, diarrhea, weakness, and in evere cases, collapsing or seizures



WHAT TO DO:

MOVE YOUR DOG TO A SHADED AND COOL AREA, PREFERABLY INDOORS, AND OFFER THEM FRESH WATER TO DRINK

WETTING THEIR PAWS, EARS, AND BELLY WITH COOL (NOT COLD) WATER CAN HELP LOWER THEIR BODY TEMPERATURE. AVOID USING ICE-COLD WATER, AS IT CAN CONSTRICT BLOOD VESSELS AND HINDER HEAT DISSIPATION

CONTACT YOUR VETERINARIAN FOR GUIE ASAP, AS THEY CAN PROVIDE SPECIFIC INSTRUCTIONS TAILORED TO YOUR DOG'S CONDITION






More pets go missing on the 4th of July than any other time of the year!


