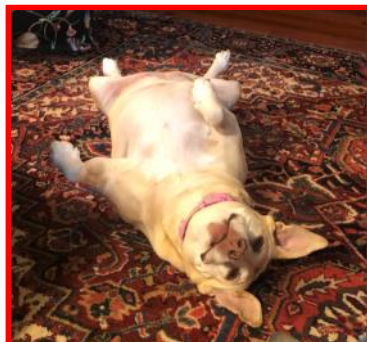

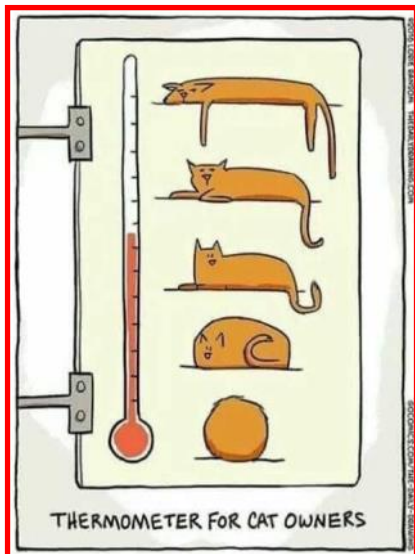

WHY DOGS PULL ON LEASH

DOGS **DON'T** PULL BECAUSE THEY WANT TO BE THE PACK LEADER / TOP DOG / ALPHA / DOMINATE / ARE ON A MISSION FOR WORLD DOMINATION

DOGS PULL ON A LEASH BECAUSE

Held captive on leash is unnatural
Dogs are meant to move around / explore an environment freely

Dogs naturally move much faster than us

Gets dogs to where they want to go faster

Walking close to us without pulling is not a natural behaviour
It requires huge impulse control

Pulling makes the person move forward

Pulling is rewarding for dogs

IS IT FAIR / ETHICAL TO EXPECT -

Dogs should never pull / always walk to heel / not explore / not stop & sniff

Use pain / discomfort - choke chains / prong collars / slip leads / yanking the leash to stop pulling

Dogs are not meant to walk like robots stuck to our side

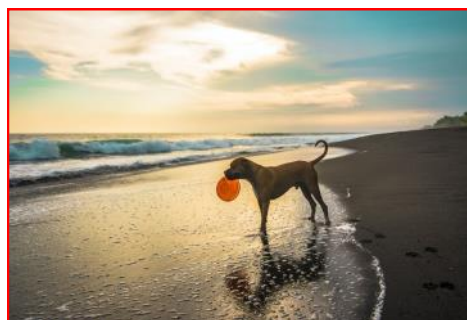

Food & Water

- ☐ Two-week supply of food for each pet

HOW HOT IS TOO HOT?!

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

One common indication of sunstroke in dogs is excessive panting, which may be accompanied by a rapid heartbeat

You might notice that your dog becomes restless, lethargic, drowsy or uncoordinated

Other symptoms can include drooling, vomiting, diarrhea, weakness, and in severe cases, collapsing or seizures



WHAT TO DO:

TAKE IMMEDIATE ACTION

MOVE YOUR DOG TO A SHADED AND COOL AREA, PREFERABLY INDOORS, AND OFFER THEM FRESH WATER TO DRINK

WETTING THEIR PAWS, EARS, AND BELLY WITH COOL (NOT COLD) WATER CAN HELP LOWER THEIR BODY TEMPERATURE. AVOID USING ICE-COLD WATER, AS IT CAN CONSTRICT BLOOD VESSELS AND HINDER HEAT DISSIPATION

CONTACT YOUR VETERINARIAN FOR GUIDANCE ASAP, AS THEY CAN PROVIDE SPECIFIC INSTRUCTIONS TAILORED TO YOUR DOG'S CONDITION

Her mom recently had professional photos done with Carmella, and emailed them to me. Beautiful happy girl!

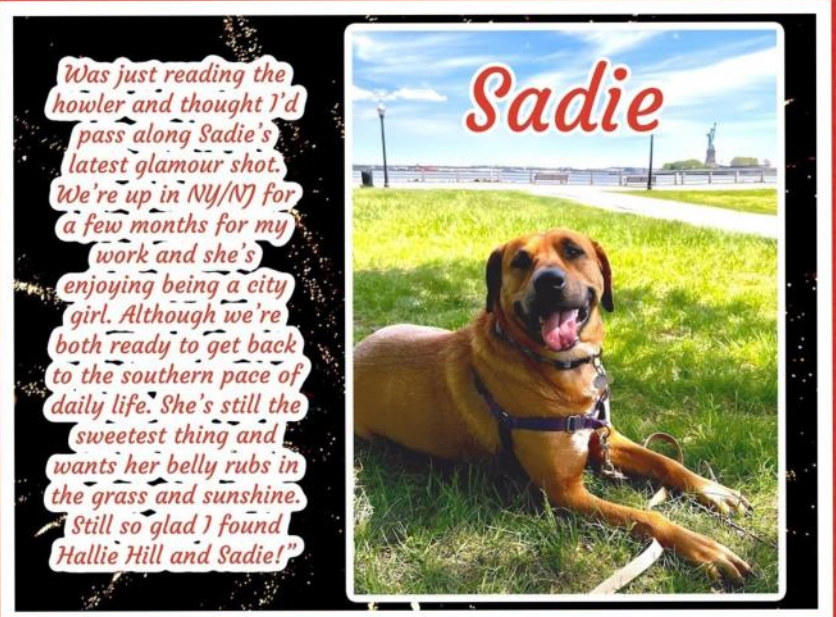

Michele Griffin, CPDT-KA, the HHAS Assistant Director has not only a passion for pets, but one for educating people about understanding companion animals and the best methods for working with them. Michele has led our current continuing education campaign wherein the sanctuary staff is completing a course to learn the best practices for working with animals in a way that improves their emotional experiences and reduces their fear, anxiety and frustration. Volunteers are also welcome to complete this course to better understand some key strategies and techniques that will make a positive impact on the emotional state of the animals in our care. Every month, for the next several months, will highlight what one of our staff members found most interesting or valuable about the program.

HAVE A FEAR FREE FOURTH!

Tackling Canine Frets & Fears During Firework Festivities

Independence Day firework festivities can turn a time of celebration into one of terror for many dogs. From the canine perspective, loud, unpredictable noises accompanied by bright lights are threatening and a cause for alarm. Some dogs react as if their very life hangs in the balance. Thankfully, it doesn't have to be that way. Here are some ways to help your dog keep calm and carry on for a Fear Free Fourth of July.

Your Pet's Veterinary Team is Here to Help

If your dog acts upset with fireworks or other loud noises, talk with your veterinarian about options to help your dog

- Your veterinarian may suggest medications or supplements to help your dog relax.
- He or she might recommend working with a veterinary behavioralist or reward-based trainer.

Set a Soothing Acoustical Sanctuary

With a little know-how, you can drown out extraneous noise and naturally calm your canine

- Use calming music such as classical, reggae, or soft rock.
- Utilize white noise to fill any gaps in the music: fans, fans, or white noise machine.
- For severe cases, you can also use noise reduction products like Mut Muffs or Happy Hoodie or just use cotton balls in their ears.

Comfort from Compression Garments

The gentle-pressure hug of a compression garment induces feelings of wellbeing for some dogs

- These mimic the soothing effect of swaddling for an infant.
- They may not work for all dogs, but when they do, the results are profound.
- Some compression garments may include gentle vibrations or music to further calm your dog

Home Help

Don't attempt to pull your dog out from hiding

- A fearful, upset dog may bite if cornered and cornered.
- Gently encourage the dog to come out on his own with a treat or a toy.

Fireworks and Fido don't mix

- Don't take your dog with you to the fireworks celebration.
- This is not only for your dog's safety and the safety of others but also to prevent further negative emotional impact.

Comfort from others

- For some dogs, the calming presence of their beloved humans or canine buddies is a confidence booster in stressful situations.

Fear of lights: Perceived light flashes and flickering can escalate your dog's anxiety

- Minimize exposure to fireworks flashes by blocking windows or taking dogs to a room with limited views of the outdoors.
- Turn on the lights in the home to decrease the contrast of light changes.

Celebrations of Independence Day may be fun for us, but probably are NOT for your pet! Review these tips and be sure to have identification on your pet, and be sure that they are microchipped (and the information is up to date!) We at Hallie wish you a safe and happy holiday!

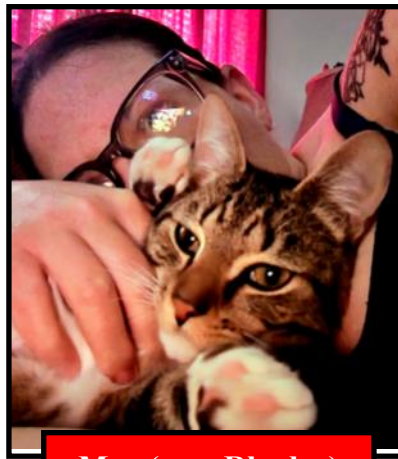
