# Hallie Hill Welcomes







# How to Decode Your Cat's Body Language

THE READER'S DIGEST VERSION



### Signs of a happy and relaxed cat

- · Eyes: Almond-shaped, sliver-shaped pupils
- · Ears: Neutral position
- · Whiskers: Neutral position
- · Body: Loose and curved
- Tail: Loosely positioned down or curved forward



### Signs of a loving cat

- · Eyes: Slowly blinking
- · Ears: Neutral position
- · Whiskers: Neutral position
- · Body: Rolling or kneading
- Tail: Loosely positioned down or curved forward



### Signs of an excited or playful cat

- · Eyes: Widened, with dilated pupils
- · Ears: Shifted forward or reversed
- · Whiskers: Forward and fanned out
- · Body: Loose and relaxed
- Tail: Upright and possibly quivering at the tip; held lower and slowly swishing



### Signs of an angry, fearful, or anxious cat

- Eyes: Wide and dilated
- · Ears: Flattened
- · Whiskers: Flattened against their face
- Body: Arched and tense, with erected fur; tightly bound, with limbs tucked
- Tail: Puffed up and/or quick swishing; tucked under their body

People with cat allergies aren't allergic to fur, but to a protein found in a cat's saliva, urine, and dander.





Things don't happen overnight! There's a learning curve for both the new family member and for the humans who chose to make the commitment of adding to the family. Things can be challenging to start but with willingness to understand and knowing that companion animals do not come prewired to our expectations, it will get easier. For us humans, it's a

happy, exciting time, "rescuing" a new family member. Our new family member, in most cases, doesn't realize they were "rescued". All they know is that their world has changed (maybe for the third, fourth or fifth time) and they are trying to figure things out! The greatest gift to give your new family member is time to adjust, clear communication, gentle guidance, understanding, room to make mistakes and not be punished for making them but to be praised and rewarded for doing things right (in our eyes or to our expectations).

It's a beautiful journey that never lasts as long as our hearts wish, so make the most of every day and cherish the time we have with these beautiful souls. Show them they matter and that they are safe. Give them choices, let them sniff and take in the world around them. Let them decide if they want to meet new people or dogs or if they are good with just walking by. Be mindful, be their advocate! Build a relationship that goes both ways. We owe it to them!
