

Donna Gamble and Josh Taber

The Canine Corner



Can Music Calm Your Dog?

- When classical music was played in an animal shelter, the dogs spent significantly more of their time quiet and resting than when other types of sounds were played, including heavy metal music, which led to increased barking
- A separate study found that when classical music was played in animal shelters, the dogs barked less and slept more; when heavy metal music was played, the dogs had more nervous shaking
- Solo piano music or piano music with simple arrangements calmed about 70% of dogs in a kennel in one study
- Harp music led to a decline in respiration rates and other visual measures of discomfort, such as restlessness and anxiety, among dogs in a veterinary hospital
- Pay attention to your dog's behavior when playing calming music to get a feeling of which type he likes best!

EDITORS NOTE: I often transport dogs to and from media appearances, and I find using music to help calm my passengers VERY helpful! LEFT: This is LeeAnn—she was a bit nervous in the car but with the music playing, this is what happened! Now it doesn't work this well with all dogs, but when it works, you'll know it! TOP RIGHT: Music streaming services have playlists that you can access for free! It's another tool in our toolbox...give it a try!



EMOTIONS MATTER!

A DOG'S EMOTIONS / WELL BEING NEED TO BE ADDRESSED BEFORE TRYING TO CHANGE A BEHAVIOUR

RECOGNISING / ADDRESSING THE EMOTION OFTEN BRINGS ABOUT A CHANGE IN BEHAVIOUR BY ITSELF

Most behaviour is rooted in an underlying emotion

Dogs experience the same range of emotions as that of a 2 to 2½ half year old child

Dogs experience the same chemical / neurological changes in the brain that we do when in an emotional state

Emotions change the way the brain functions affecting behaviour & well being

Ignoring / punishing / suppressing / correcting an emotional response does not stop dogs from feeling that emotion

Some ways to encourage emotional well-being

- Rest / sleep / decompress - especially after a busy / stressful time
- Allow choice when appropriate / consent
- Enrichment - mental & physical - provide outlets for breed needs
- Predictable patterns / consistency / stability
- Understand / notice / listen to body language
- Create an environment where your dog feels safe / secure
- Create distance when a dog is uncomfortable / reacting
- Social connection - dogs need to spend time with their people
- Check for painful conditions / silent pain

<p>catster</p> <p>Pheomelanin Pigment Creates Their Color: Like humans with red hair, orange cats produce a pigment called pheomelanin. This pigment is responsible for all ginger cats and their human counterparts.</p>	<p>catster</p> <p>Most Orange Tabby Cats Are Males: A whopping 80% of all orange tabby cats are males. Why? It all comes down to chromosomes. To produce this beautiful coat color, the females need two orange genes-one from each parent-whereas males need only one. So, it's much easier to wind up with a boy.</p>	<p>catster</p> <p>All Tabbies have a Distinct Forehead Marking: Many legends come from the infamous "M" shape on the orange tabby's head. Some say that Mother Mary kissed the cat to bless them for rocking baby Jesus to sleep. Another legend says that an orange tabby killed a snake for Muhammad, who then put his mark on the cat.</p>	<p>catster</p> <p>The Orange Tabby Isn't a Particular Breed: Many breeds can have the orange tabby look, so the color isn't dependent on a specific type of cat.</p>
