

About the "Flora and Fun" Quilts



For much of its history, quilting was primarily a practical technique to provide physical protection and insulation. However, decorative elements were often also present, and many quilts are now primarily art pieces. Delight in the colorful and cheerful designs of this year's quilts, made with fabric designed by artist Subhashini Narayanan from Robert Kaufman Fabrics. Featuring colorful creatures, flowers, and foliage stitched in a sunburst-inspired Dresden Square pattern, these handmade quilts will add whimsy to any space!





Intolerant of certain play styles / breeds with a person Needs space

Despite all the appropriate socialization at the right time, not every dog will be sociable

Dogs are individuals - never force a dog to be what you believe they should be Disclose



DISTANCE ASSISTANCE

CREATING ENOUGH DISTANCE FROM A TRIGGER IS AN EFFECTIVE WAY TO HELP A REACTIVE DOG COPE

REACTIVE DOGS ARE OFTEN THOSE THAT FEEL THE MOST ANXIOUS / STRESSED/ THREATENED / FRUSTRATED

REACTIVE DOGS ARE -

- struggling to cope in a situation
- want the scary thing to go away
- need more space / distance
- don't know how else to react
- need our help to move away
- may be in pain

These feelings result in high levels of stress / adrenaline / cortisol which can take days to subside Dogs Disclosed


ENOUGH DISTANCE =

- lowers stress levels
- able to process information
- build more confidence / trust
- feels safer / provides choicebegin to form more positive associations

With sufficient distance / time / patience & consistency, reactive dogs may be able to get closer to a trigger without a reaction


<u>Hagen</u>
